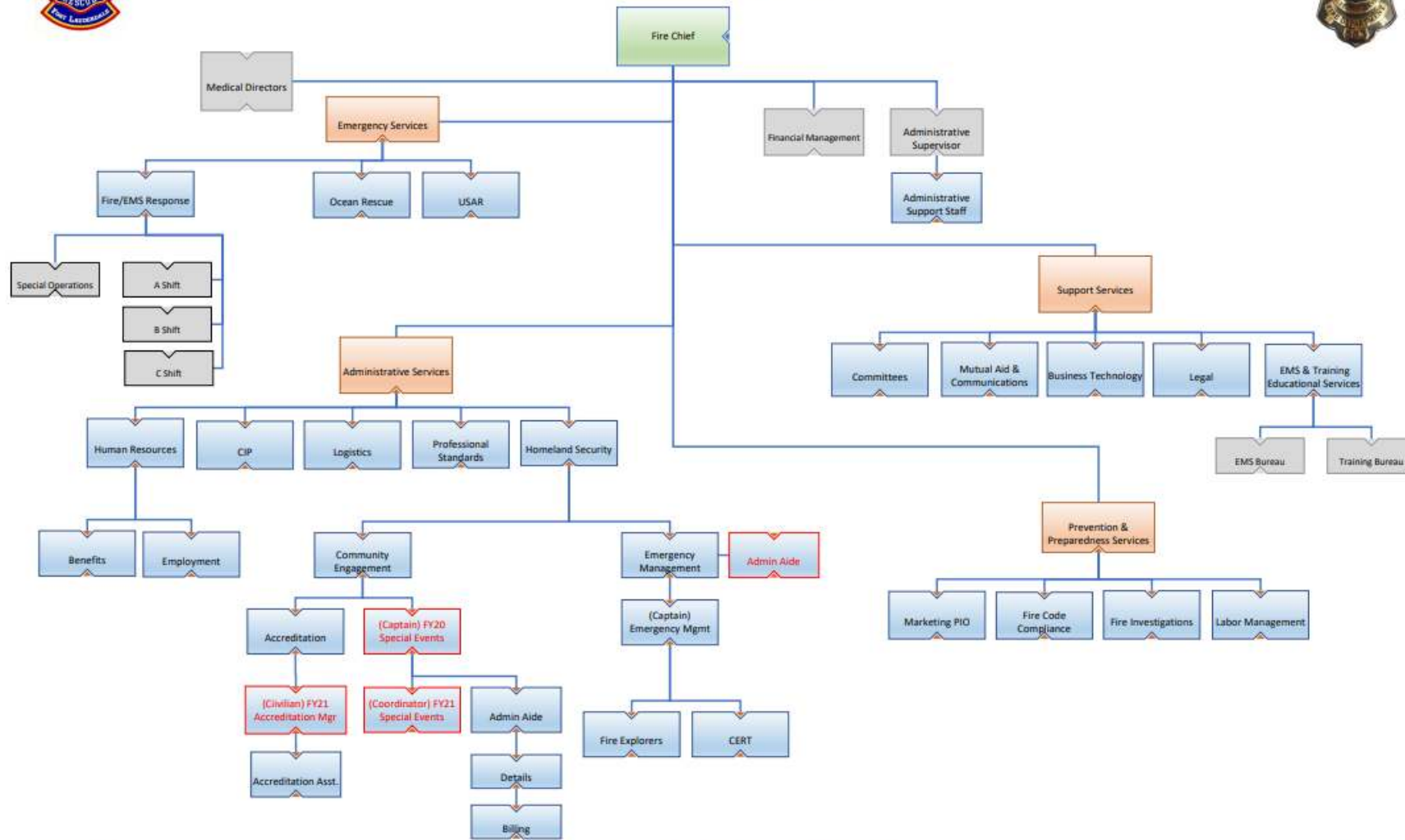

Topic Centric Org Chart



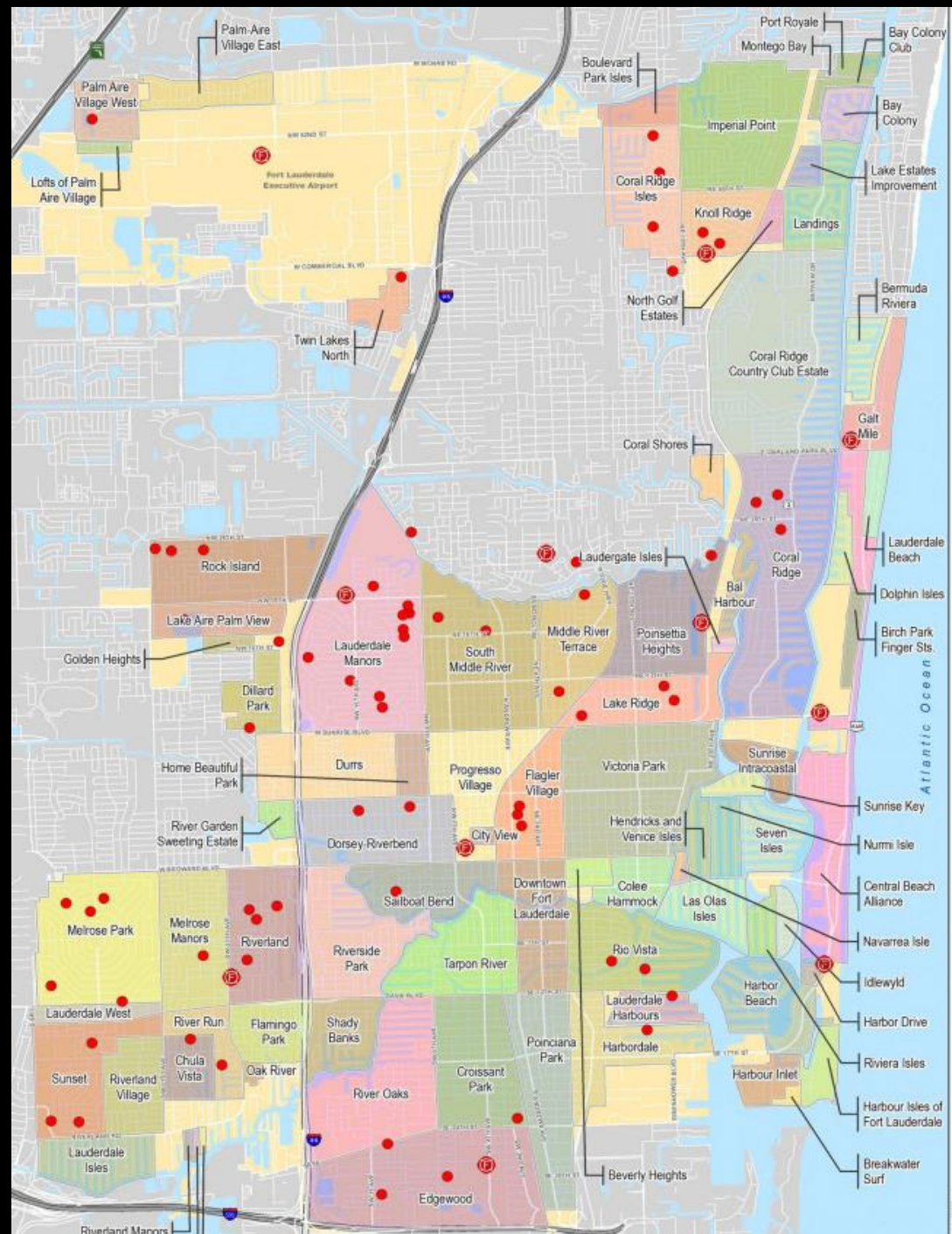
Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue 2019 Administrative Organizational Chart

Standard of Coverage

- *Standard of Coverage* are measuring points that are set through accreditation to gauge how efficiently we are serving our community.
- Our Standard of Coverage for calls in Fort Lauderdale **90%** of the time is as follows:
 - On Medical Calls, we strive to be on scene within **6 minutes**
 - On Residential Fire Calls, we strive to have **16 people** on scene within **10 minutes and 20 second**
 - On Commercial Fires, we strive to have **22 people** on scene within **14 minutes and 20 seconds**
