Welcome and Call to Order 630PM

Roll Call- Stubbs, Lockwood, Currie, Ulmer, Concannon, Manning, Castillo, Mammano, Bowker, Peloquin (Albetta is absent) Association Quorum is Confirmed by Mary Peloquin

Introduction of Guests:

- **City Manager Chris Lagerbloom** – City Updates and Importance of Community
 - Flood- Eta 24 hour period 11.5 inches at treatment plant all at 1 time plus rain prior few days impacted water table. More flooding than others 18 active pumping overnight and up to 26 in am and hope to have it cleared up significantly by weekend. Offer to guide residents if need. Melrose(s) ditch/swale nowhere for water to go w/ these significant rains plus high water table.
 - Marie Pierce, runs city stormwater operations in Melrose neighborhoods in past 3 weeks haven't seen rain like this before.
 - Melrose(s) work is daunting opened eyes to new challenges/considerations as move forward in these areas.
 - Manors has no active drainage (gravity system) looking to way to tie in. Improvements as remediate b/c design/construction likely 2 yr w/ fast track
 - Park looking where need to make capacity improvements leaning heavy on engineering
 - Intrusion in the City has occurred
 - All in city pay to stormwater, river oaks is slated to begin late spring early summer 2021, storm surge study sustainability folks are on this and the various feasible, groundwater normal this time of year 11/9 just under 7ft 11/10 just under 6ft, downward trend staying at 5.25ft since, so now a bit more than 1 foot to depth of water
 - Water is released into stormwater system
 - Opioid continue w/ multidistrict not DOJ cases. Still plaintiff 45million estimate in

bankruptcy court

- Reopen mills pond testing, holiday testing site being pumped now and DOH estimates thurs 9am reopen (2tests) no reservation required system 9-3pm line served by 6pm
- Chief of Police- 1st round of VIRTUAL interviews did not happen yesterday 11/9 more than half not available offer 11/11 not a lot of support looking at next week. Then in person may have delayed a couple weeks due to this delay.
- Requested Gassman to try to make it if can
- Since 7/2019 recap from chris
 - No water, hurricane dorian, holiday sewer breaks 17 in 120 days, longest/largest repair approved in city, 1.5 miles turned on recently, covid closed beach 3/15, George Floyd & 5/31 protests here, covid still, Eta,
 - Looked to ability to get past and focus on moving forward since then
 - Reference to Lagerbloom/Rajter covid treatment and recovery of Lagerbloom family
 - Highlight of community connections during this time frame and CFLCA link to that.
- **Dr. JJ Rajter**, Critical Care Medicine Specialist and Pulmonologist – Covid Updates
 - Vaccine news- cautiously optimistic b/c full data not available & its prelim. Data released only & 43500 enrolled in study of those 94 contracted covid19. Don't know makeup/co-morbidities. Some positive news if it holds true could be better than flu vaccine. Concerns only 50 million avail. Doses in 2020 and each person needs 2 does. That number is worldwide by 2020 1.3 billion can be manufactured. Possible other vaccine infos to come out in next month(s) from other places/companies.
 - Study data not available for review rely on company
 - No info on how long immunity last after vaccine
 - Suspect may need more after 6 mo
 - Side effects long term not known b/c of quickly pushing out normally vaccine 10 years this was less than 12 months
 - New mutation of virus came out of Denmark grown into minx.
 - EliLilly emergency use auth antibody 2 small studies 465 outpatients were put in 4 groups different MG doses/placebo most clear by 11 days now not new, at 28 days 3% of people ended admitted to hospital vs. 10 percent in placebo arm. So did see risk reduction

 - Worldwide data [here](#) Milan/Franc #'s in hospitals are bad.
 - Dashboard data conflicts: collection variations so not uncommon to see minor differences, concern is when large differences
 - Herd Immunity: reference to past remarks and jails result was if this was done would have many millions dead and does not like this
 - Possibility of combinations could be Key in this respect. Also contact tracing is very important when #'s make that a realistic task.
