

Charter Revision Board

- “Advisory” in nature
- Does analysis of current language
- Takes public input – *Public Participation Highly Encouraged !*
- Discusses all aspects of what should be or shouldn’t be contained in the charter
- Discusses how the language should be written
- Conclusion of its work still goes to the commission to adopt or reject
- Finally, revisions goes to the public for a vote and only the public can vote on final changes
- Same process as process public vote on County Charter Amendments and State Constitutional Amendments

The duties of the Charter Revision Board are discussed in Section 2-231 of the Code of Ordinances:

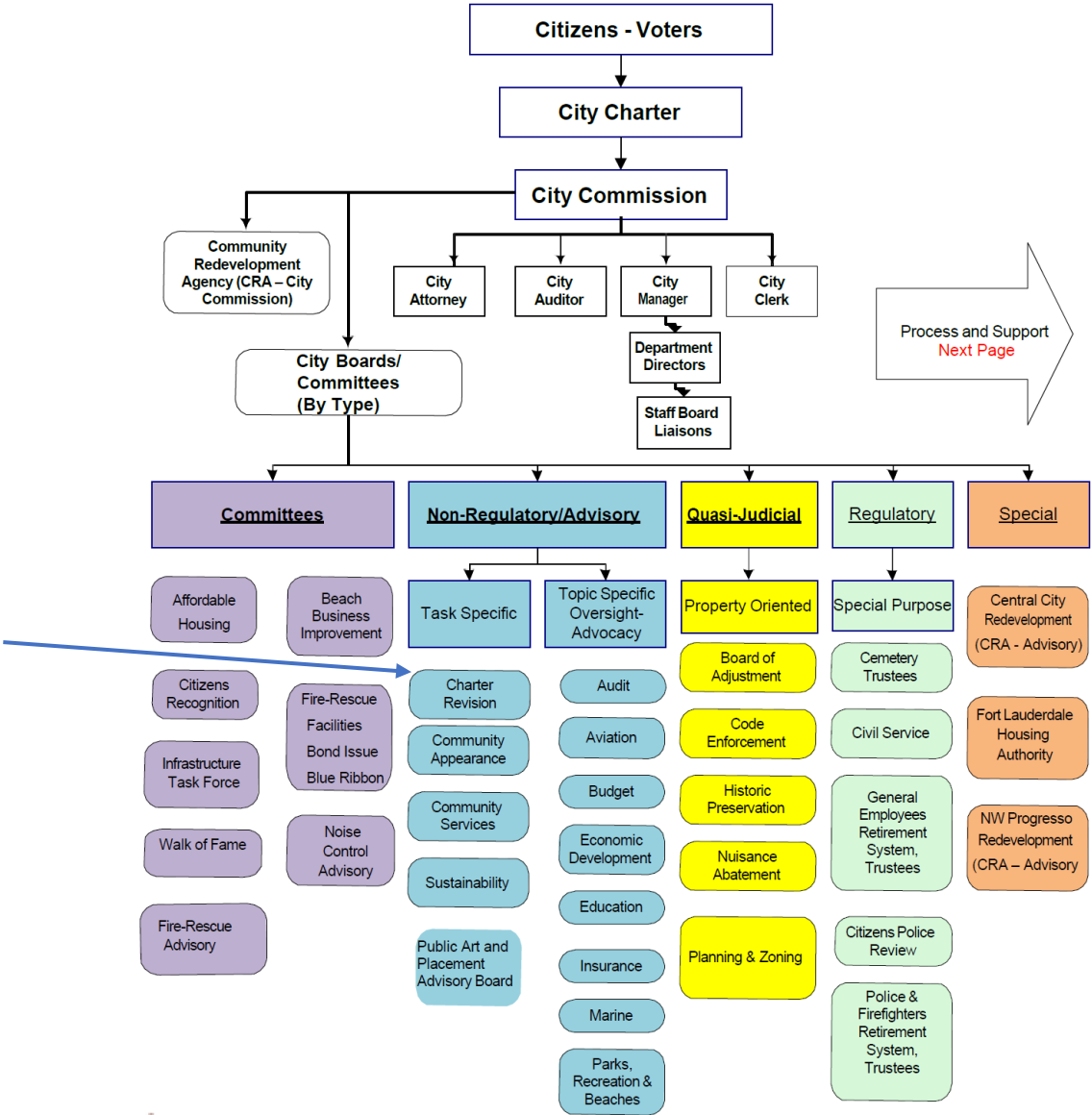
•**Sec. 2-231. - Established; term; compensation; duties.**

There is hereby created an advisory board to the city commission, known as the **charter revision board**, whose members shall serve for a term of one (1) year from the date of their appointment and without compensation, for the purpose of advising the city commission on the propriety of the existing charter and, further, to make such suggestions and recommendations to perfect the charter so as to establish a better government of and for the city.
